The magnitude of the problem of HIV/AIDS, in terms of the numbers of affected children, is enormous. The World Health Organization estimated that at the end of 2003, there were 2.1 million (95% CI 2.1 to 2.9 million) children living with AIDS worldwide, with 2 to 2.2 million of them residing in Sub-Saharan Africa (1).

HIV & AIDS in Children | Save the Children
Kids in communities affected by AIDS who have lost parents and family members are also more vulnerable to HIV infection. They may lack caregivers, access to school, or the ability to stand up for their rights. Children can be infected through sexual abuse or rape.

Care for children affected by HIV and AIDS
HIV can pass from a mother with HIV to her child during pregnancy, childbirth, or breastfeeding (called mother-to-child transmission of HIV). In the United States, the most common way children under 13 years of age get HIV is through mother-to-child transmission of HIV. Most youth who get HIV during adolescence are infected through sex.

Home - The Coalition for Children Affected by AIDS
To date, there have been few studies conducted to explore the lives of children affected by HIV/AIDS in China. In a cross-sectional survey of 251 AIDS orphans conducted in 5 provinces, 61% of children lived with surviving parents and over 15% of children had lost both parents.
