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The Return of Character Education - Educational Leadership

The 11 Principles of Effective Character were originally authored by Thomas Lickona, Eric Schaps and Catherine Lewis for Character.org, then the Character Education Partnership, in 1995. They were developed after a study comparing a multitude of successful schools. Their common traits became the 11 Principles.

WHAT IS CHARACTER EDUCATION AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT ...

Thomas Lickona defines character education as "the deliberate effort to develop virtues that are good for the individual and good for society." More recently, psychologist Robert McGrath has proposed that character education is less focused on social skill acquisition and more on constructing a moral identity within a life narrative.
