While the perennial herbs can be planted in early spring, the warm-season crops (basil, parsley) should not be planted outdoors until after Western Washington's last average frost-free date, May 15. Some years, when the spring is particularly cool and wet, it's best to wait until the first of June.

Certified seed garlic has been grown specifically for planting in the garden and is free of insects and diseases. Plant garlic in early to mid-fall (September to October) in eastern Washington gardens and late fall (November) in western Washington gardens. To prepare the planting area, loosen the soil to improve drainage.

Starting An Herb Garden: How To Plant An Herb Garden

For planting Herbs, you need approximately 1 to 4 feet in diameter for each plant, depending on the plant. Here are some general guidelines for plant sizes: 3-4 feet - Rosemary, Sage, Mints, Oregano, Marjoram 2 feet - Basils, Thyme, Tarragon, Savory

Bee Balm - This herb attracts hummingbirds and provides an attractive red color to your garden. Transplant it to other areas of your garden for highlights when it starts to spread. Rosemary - This herb generally does

well as long as the winter isn't too harsh. It grows to the size of a shrub in the Pacific Northwest.

Some herbs are easy to start from seed, but others take a long time to germinate. Buy slow-growers at a nursery or divide existing plants. In some cases, you can grow new plants from cuttings. From Seed: Before sowing any herb, whether in seed-starting trays or directly in the garden, read the seed packet, which will give you important information.

Herb tinctures use alcohol to suspend the essence from the herbs, while herbal wine and elixirs are low alcohol content herb extracts. There are also dry extracts in which the plants are allowed to evaporate their liquid content into a dry mass, which can then be contained in a capsule or tablet.
