The pectoralis major myocutaneous flap was described by Hueston and McConchie 9 in 1968. Its use in the head and neck was reported by Ariyan 10 and also by Baek and colleagues 11 in 1979. The pectoralis major myocutaneous flap quickly became the workhorse flap of head and neck reconstruction.

The pectoralis major myocutaneous (PMMC) flap has always been considered the workhorse flap for oral, head, and neck reconstruction. In 1979, Ariyan was the first to describe the use of the PMMC flap in head and neck reconstruction.

One of the earliest methods described involved development of the pectoralis major (PM) myocutaneous flap, which was first used by Dr. Stephan Ariyan in the late 1970s for reconstruction of ablative surgical defects in patients with head and neck cancer.

Pectoralis major myocutaneous flap reconstruction was done as a primary procedure in 95 patients, and 5 were salvage procedures (reconstruction after fistula and coverage of exposed mandibular prosthesis). PMMC flap was used to cover mucosal defect in 84 patients, skin defects in 10 patient and both in 6 patients (bipaddled).

Despite the attractiveness, feasibility and success rates of free tissue transfer, the role of the pectoralis major myocutaneous flap is irreplaceable in the setting of high-risk patients, the vessel-depleted neck, and in overall poor free tissue transfer surgical candidates.

The pectoralis major myocutaneous flap for reconstruction was first described in 1968. Its application in the head and neck region, however, was not reported until Ariyan's publication in 1979. The reliability and versatility of this flap were subsequently confirmed by many other reports.

Pectoralis major myocutaneous flap - HNS preferences

The pectoralis major muscle flap was first described by Pickrell in 1947 as a turnover flap in chest wall reconstruction but did not gain widespread acceptance until Arnold and Pairolero's major contributions to chest wall reconstruction in the 1970s and 1980s.
